Read and reread a story to identify important story elements. Synthesize story elements to determine the theme of a story.

Figurative Language in a Poem

Identify figurative language.

Visualize to interpret figurative language.

Structure in a Poem

Identify structural elements within a poem.

Use structure to interpret a poem's meaning.

Preparing to Read an Informational Text

Group domain-specific words into families.

Use text features to preview an informational text.



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Procedural Steps in an Informational Text

Follow the steps of a procedural text.

Preview a procedural text.

Compare-and-Contrast Structure in an Informational Text

Create mental models to understand compare-and-contrast text structure.

Recognize compare-and-contrast text structure.

Cause-and-Effect Structure in an Informational Text

Distinguish causes from effects.

Recognize cause-and-effect structure in an informational text.

Problem-Solution Structure in an Informational Text

Recognize problem-solution text structure.

Use text structure to predict what will come next in the text.

Central Ideas in an Informational Text

Identify central ideas and supporting details in an informational text.

Make text-to-self and text-to-world connections using an informational text.

Important Details in an Informational Text

Paraphrase the most important details of an informational text.

Summarize an informational text.

Description in an Informational Text

Identify an author's purpose in an informational text.

Recognize descriptive details in an informational text.

Making Inferences about an Informational Text

Make inferences about an informational text.

Support inferences about an informational text.

Argument in an Informational Text

Identify reason and evidence in an argumentative text.

Recognize the claim in an argumentative text.
