## Using Imagine Edgenuity with Instructional Services

## Using Imagine Edgenuity with District Teachers

Imagine Edgenuity curriculum is frequently used with district teachers instead of Imagine Edgenuity instructors from the Instructional Services group. However, if you are using district teachers, your school or district must contact the NCAA Eligibility Center to submit a Nontraditional Course Questionnaire to describe your implementation model.

Part of the NCAA's review of nontraditional schools and programs is a "Core Course Analysis," which examines the content and assessments being offered.

If you are using Imagine Edgenuity's approved initial-credit courses in their entirety with no customizations, it should not be necessary to submit the NCAA's "Core Course Analysis," which is the last question on the Nontraditional Course Questionnaire. Simply indicate that your district is using Imagine Edgenuity's approved core courses and attach a copy of your Imagine Edgenuity contract.
