

# Careers in Logistics Planning and Management Services

## Course Overview and Syllabus

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**Grade level:** 9–12

**Prerequisite Courses:** None

**Credits:** 0.5

### Course Description

Careers in Logistics Planning and Management Services is a semester-long course that provides high school students with the history of logistics and recent advances in the field. Units include supply chain management, inventory and transportation management, and safety in the workplace. Logistics is a high-growth industry and stable career choice. There is something for every career-seeker, ability, and experience level. The objectives of this course are to introduce the student to the field of logistics planning and management and to explain the career opportunities that are available in this field.

### Course Objectives

Throughout the course, you will meet the following goals:

- Learn the history of logistics and how society depends on the ability to transport goods
- Explore how logistics integrates information, people, products, transportation, and distribution
- Discuss safety in modern packaging, and how it protects goods while keeping costs low
- Examine how sustainable trends in logistics are growing to provide safe packaging and handling procedures
- Demonstrate an understanding of managing inventory and ensuring proper flow
- Discover how companies build working relationships with one another and work together to maintain profitability
- Identify the different modes for transporting people and goods, as close as across town and as far away as space
- Learn how documentation is used to identify goods, to determine their origin and destination, and to enable tracking
- Explore OSHA's role in the workplace, and the rights and responsibilities of employers and employees
- Evaluate your own abilities, aptitudes, interests, and values to make long-term career plans

## Student Expectations

This course requires the same level of commitment from you as a traditional classroom course. Throughout the course, you are expected to spend approximately 5–7 hours per week online on:

- Interactive lessons that include a mixture of videos, readings, and tasks
- Assignments in which you apply and extend learning in each lesson
- Assessments, including quizzes, tests, and cumulative exams

You will also communicate with classmates, either via online tools or face to face, as you collaborate on projects, ask and answer questions in your peer group, and develop your speaking and listening skills.
